

Council Highlights

October 27, 2021

Key highlights:

Durham Regional Council approved the Comprehensive Master Plan for Paramedic Services via report #2021-MOH-5. The plan uses data and research to recommend paramedic solutions for Durham Region, while considering population and age projections for the next decade.

Council endorsed the Regional Cycling Plan 2021 via report #2021-COW-26. The updated Regional Cycling Plan identifies actions for creating a connected, safe and accessible region-wide cycling network.

Council approved the Request for funding from Lake Simcoe Region Conservation for the acquisition of land adjacent to the Beaverton River Wetland Conservation Area in the Township of Brock, via report #2021-COW-27. The requested amount of \$51,917, represents 40 per cent of the eligible acquisition costs of approximately 137 acres of land.

Council received the myDurham 311 Public Consultation (#2021-INFO-103) for information, via Council Information Package. The report presents the key findings of a public opinion survey that was conducted during March and April 2021, and outlines the significance of the findings to the service design and implementation of myDurham 311.

Council received the #ImmigrantsWork in Durham Region Initiative (#2021-INFO-104) for information, via Council Information Package. The report provides an overview of the initiative including its background, partners, and goals.
