## The DRIFF summer drive-in film series continues this month

---

Durham Region International Film Festival's (DRIFF) summer drive-in film series, **Shifting the Narrative**, continues on **September 9 and 30** at DRIFF's drive-in headquarters at the Town of Whitby Municipal Building (575 Rossland Road East, Whitby).

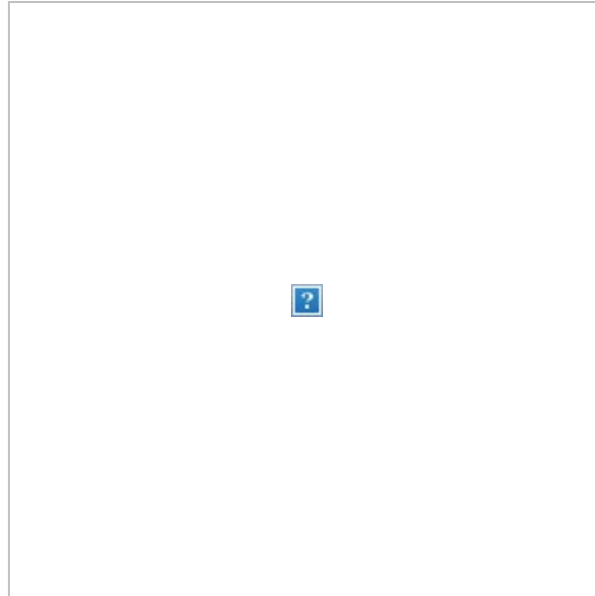
On **September 9**, DRIFF presents **Window Horses: The Poetic Persian Epiphany of Rosie Ming**, a dazzling animated film depicting the coming-of-age of a young Canadian poet travelling through Iran. In collaboration with the DRIFF team, **Window Horses** director Ann Marie Fleming has personally selected Caroline Soo Jung Lee's short film **At the Bottom of the Sea** to open the evening. Lee's visually experimental short film was filmed in Seoul in 2018, and documents the growing feminist movement against systemic misogyny, surveillance and widespread sexism in South Korea.

On **September 30**, DRIFF is honouring the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation with

two powerful films directed by Indigenous women. The feature presentation, Darlene Naponse's **Falls Around Her**, stars Tantoo Cardinal as an Anishnaabe rock star whose fame conflicts with her desire to return to her reserve to recharge and reconnect to her roots. Naponse selected the short film **Chocolate**, directed by Charlene Moore, to open the evening.
