





- To share <u>ideas</u>, <u>priorities</u>, and <u>concerns</u> regarding the local parks and recreation system




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Question Two

 - Examples may include parks, trails, and associated facilities such as sports fields, splash pads, hard surface courts, playgrounds, etc.




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Question Four
