The Board

Business Financing

 Community Futures organizations provide capital (loans) to small business enterprises



Business Financing

- Typical clients would be business start ups, acquisitions of an existing businesses or enterprises looking to expand / refinance
- Loans can range from as little as \$1,000 to a maximum of \$250,000 and take the form of a term or operating loan
- Our tolerance for risk is supposed to be much higher than a chartered bank's We can also be more creative from a security viewpoint

Business Financing

- We have about \$3.3 million of lending funds under CF management
- We can also do partnered loans with Georgina Association for Business that allow us to provide up to \$400,000
- GAB has an additional \$3 million under management

Streetscaping Loans

- A financing product designed to compliment downtown improvement planning and municipal grant programs
- Any business operating in the designated improvement area with a project consistent with the approved design elements is **pre-approved** for up to \$10,000 with no financial due diligence.
- These funds can be used to lever municipal streetscaping funding programs.

Streetscaping Loans



- Security is a promissory note and GSA
- Interest is set at prime + 2% with a 5 year amortization

Community Planning

- We develop our own 5 year plan that incorporates and prioritizes the key elements, as determined through stakeholder consultations,
- We also assist local NFPs with planning
- The planning work we do with partners and stakeholders provides a framework for funding decisions.

Community Economic Development

- CED is a holistic approach to economic development
- Focus is on community capacity building and developing sustainable communities
- Looks at many different aspects of community development

Eastern Ontario Development Program

- Entering an 8th round of funding (\$146,200,000)
 - May / 04 \$10,000,000
 - **Feb. / 05 \$8,200,000**
 - Aug. / 06 \$10,000,000
 - Mar. / 07 \$10,000,000
 - Feb. / 08 \$10,000,000
 - May / 09 \$20,000,000 for two years
 - Oct. / 11 \$30,000,000 for three years
 - Dec. / 13 \$48,000,000 for five years
- SLCFDC has, or will have, directly managed about \$7 million of this
 - Only 15 CFDCs in the country have a resource like this

EODP Summary Results

- Over 400 projects supported
- Over \$6 million distributed locally
 - This will be \$7 million by the time our current agreements run their course
- More than \$7.5 million of additional levered investment (private, institutional or other level of government)
- Over \$13.5 million total investment to date
