

# What's Been Happening? Brock

- Council has been in office for 10 months
- Council & Staff have done a number of education and training sessions
- Numerous staff changes have occurred (retirements, new positions, etc.)

#### Accomplishments to date:

- 0% tax increase in 2019
- New Development Charge Study
- New Asset Management Plan
- Implementing numerous modernization initiatives
- Lots of opportunity for public input & feedback
- Operational Review Completed

# **Operational Review Overview**



#### Why an Operational Review?

 Council felt that a full review of the organization was needed to address the existing organizational structure and design, governance issues and to assess reputation with public, staff and Council

#### Who?

 Consultants Garry Cubitt & Garth Johns were hired to complete the review





#### Approach?

The Consultants:

- reviewed extensively all documentation available
- Conducted 39 interviews (staff, councillors, public)
- Conducted a public survey and received 267 responses
- 22 recommendations (summarized in the next few slides)

# Completed Recommendations



- 1. Reporting of minutes has been changed
  - Only reflecting key issues, actions and decisions
- 2. Reports to Council have been standardize
  - require sign off by CAO
  - if any financial implications, Treasurer has seen & supports



- 3. Procedural By-law has been updated
  - Notice of motions, consent agenda, etc.

# **Completed Recommendations**



- 4. Committee of the Whole Structure Implemented
- 6. Council 101 Education Session has been held
  - Focus was on governance and council/staff relations
- 8. New organizational chart
  - Recreation is now under the Clerk's Department
  - Planning is now under the Building Department
- 15. Hired a Township Planner

# Recommendations In Progress



- 9. Reserve funds need to be reduced, condensed and clearly understood
  - Need to identify clearly the purpose and source of each fund
  - Educational session to be led by Treasurer with recommendations for changes on October 7, 2019



- 10. Need to modernize all operating systems
  - \$725,000 has been delivered from Province
  - Report from the Clerk to come in October
- 11. Update all Brock Township social media pages, communication tools, and practices
  - Needs to become more of an effective communications tool
  - To be led by Clerks' Department



# Recommendations In Progress



- 13. Developing a new "service" oriented mentality and culture
  - New Receptionist position
  - The New CAO needs to create and maintain an appropriate culture
  - Township needs to become more customer friend



- 14. Recruitment process for new CAO has started Need a contemporary individual
  - Looking for a contemporary individual who is a coach, leader, team builder and customer oriented

- 12. Develop business plans that align with the new Strategic Plan and support the budget for 2020 and beyond
  - Regular reports and updates need to be submitted to keep Council duly apprised






- 16. Economic Development needs to become a priority



Brock Township Official Plan (OP)


- By-laws
- All "urban" lands / lands in our settlement areas are directed by the Brock OP

Because we are a two-tiered Regional system, the Region of Durham's OP and policies guide planning on rural lands, with the Township as a commenting agency. For planning matters in settlement areas (towns and hamlets), the direction comes from the Township OP with the Region becoming the commenting agency.

The Township of Brock Building Department is again experiencing unprecedented growth in 2019. To date, in 2019 we have issued 286 building permits with a total construction value of 77 million dollars.



#### **CANNINGTON**

Durham Region Non-Profit Housing Project

50-unit Durham Region Non-Profit Housing Project is well underway with an expected completion date of February 2020.





#### **BEAVERTON**

#### Marydel Subdivision

350 dwelling unit subdivision currently under construction. Occupancy permits have been granted to just over 100 units, with the remainder to be completed over the next 2 years.





#### **SUNDERLAND**

Sunderland Meadows Subdivision Phase 1

Consisting of a 102-unit subdivision with the housing component complete and the final grading and completion of the infrastructure ongoing.







#### Our Staff and Infrastructure



3 Divisions made up of 24 Full-Time and 11 Part-Time Staff

- 1) Facilities & Parks (1 Supervisor, ½ Administrative Assistant, 6 FT Staff, 4 PT)
- 2) Road Operations (1 Supervisor, 1 Administrative Staff, 13 FT Staff, 7 PT)
- 3) Engineering (1 Director, ½ Administrative Assistant)

Responsible for managing a large number of infrastructure assets including:

- 365 km of Roads (including ditches and driveway culverts)
- 25.5 km of Sidewalks & Parks
- 89 Bridges and Culverts >3m in diameter
- 31 Municipal Buildings & Structures
- 67 Playgrounds/Fields/Play Structures
- 15 Parking Lots
- 4 Storm Ponds
- 6.3km of Storm Sewers
- Beaverton Harbour

  - Lake Ridge/RR 13 Intersection Improvements (Spring 2020)
- Arenas (Ice is back!)
- Beaverton Harbour Survey/Action Plan (ongoing)
- Community Safety Portable Speed Radar Signs, Share the Road signage, Community Safety Zones, Flexible Bollards, etc
- Municipal 511
- Wayfinding Signage (Ongoing)
