Beaverton Harbour Park Pass

The Township will be opening the Beaverton Harbour Park (beach area, picnic shelter and splashpad) for Brock Residents & Property Owners only on Monday, July 6, 2020. The area will be open daily from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. The splashpad will be open from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. Residents are encouraged to go <u>online</u> and apply for their pass to access the Beaverton Harbour in advance of July 6th.

*Please note that if you applied for a pass after June 26, 2020, it will take more than 10 days to process your pass due to the large number of requests received. Every effort will be made for all pass requests received prior to June 26, 2020 to be completed and sent to the resident prior to July 6, 2020. Thank you for your patience and understanding.

FAQ's

Q: Is this limited to Beaverton residents only or all Brock residents?

A: The Beaverton Harbour Park will be opened for all Brock residents and property owners was a pass.

Q: What does the pass give me access to?

A: The pass will allow you to access the Beaverton Harbour Park area and use of the beach and picnic shelter between the hours of 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. daily. The splashpad will be operational from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Q: Who is monitoring this?

A: Township Staff will be situated at the entrance of the Beaverton Harbour Park and in order to enter the area you will be required to show your pass. Staff assigned to monitor this area will make every effort to ensure residents are processed through in an efficient and respectful manner. Please work with us in the same fashion to ensure everyone has a good day.

Q: Does each family member need a pass?

A: No. Each pass will allow a maximum of six (6) people to enter the area at the same time. For each pass applied for, families will be provided with two passes to use for their family.

Q: Are we required to show ID with our pass when we enter the park area? A: No. You will just be required to show you pass. However, upon request, an officer could ask you to show your ID.

Q: Is the pass required to access all areas of the Beaverton Harbour? A: No. It is only required to access the park area.

Q: Is a pass required to access other Township of Brock beaches when they open? A: Not at this time. No pass is required to access any other areas in Brock, including all other beaches.

Q: What is going to stop me from printing multiple passes off and giving them to non-residents? A: It is our sincere hope that Township residents do not do this. The Township has put this in place to ensure that Brock residents can enjoy these amenities in a safe environment. In addition, at anytime an officer may require you to show you ID with your pass. Each pass will be numbered so that it can be tracked as to the family it is linked to. Q: We are a tenant in Brock but do not have a formal lease agreement. What documentation can we provide instead?

A: Utility bill and a piece of ID that shows your Brock address.

Q: Is a pass required to access Barney's restaurant?

A: No pass is required to access any other areas at the Harbour except for the park area (Splashpad, beach, picnic area).

Q: Do I have to pay to park at the Harbour?

A: Day time parking is free. However, if you wish to park overnight, you will be required to purchase a pass online.

Q: Do I have to have a pass to access the pier?

A: The pier is currently closed.

Q: I am a resident of Brock and my grandchildren are visiting for the weekend. Am I permitted to take them with my pass?

A: Yes. As noted above, each pass will allow you to enter with up to six (6) people.

Q: What happens if I ruin or loose my pass?

A: If you received it via electronic means, re-print a copy of your pass. If you received it by mail, please contact the Township to be provided with another pass.

Q: Do students have to have a pass to enter the Harbour Park area?

A: Students can either show their family pass or their Brock High School student ID card.

Reminder: Passes are not required for the restaurant, boat launch, and kayak dock at the Beaverton Harbour.

When using the Beaverton Harbour Park area we remind residents of the following:

- A limit of 15 kids are permitted to be in the Splashpad at one time;
- We ask that each kid use the Splashpad for 20 minutes at one time to allow others an opportunity to use it;
- Stay home if you are sick;
- Practice Social Distancing;
- Follow all guidance in group gatherings; and
- Amenities are not sanitized. Please use at own risk (benches, tables, etc.)
