Restrictions	Fire to be at least 15 metres (50 feet) away from all structures, trees, hedges, fences, property lines, street/road/highway or overhead wires	Fire to be at least 6 metres (18 feet) away from all structures, trees, hedges, fences, property lines, street/road/highway or overhead wires	Fire to be at least 50 metres (150 feet) away from all structures, trees, hedges, fences, property lines, street/road/highway or overhead wires
